he Kohat Dialysis Unit of Ittefaq Kidney and General Welfare Hospital was established in 2004 at Liaquat Memorial Hospital, under the leadership of Mr. Haji Manzoor Ahmed Paracha, Director of the Kohat Unit.

A renowned social worker, Mr. Paracha has dedicated his life to serving the community through education and healthcare initiatives in Kohat and surrounding areas. This free dialysis unit was a combined effort of Lt. Gen (Late) Iftikhar Hussain Shah, former Governor of KPK, Mr. Manzoor Paracha, Mr. Syed Qalb-e-Hassan (MPA Kohat at the time), Mr. Tariq Hussain Shah (District Council Member), and Malik Asad (District Nazim).

They secured and renovated the facility at Liaquat Memorial Hospital, creating the first dialysis unit in Kohat. A few years ago, the center was relocated to Melam Center, near the City Post Office, Kohat.Today, the Kohat unit is equipped with 12 modern dialysis machines, 5 of which are dedicated to patients with hepatitis. The facility serves up to 24 dialysis patients daily, providing much-needed care to those in need.

ITTEFAQ TRADERS COMMUNITY WELFARE PROGRAMME NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS: FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2024

1. NATURE OF BUSINESS

"Ittefaq Traders Community Welfare Programme" (The Organization) is registered under the Directorate of Social Welfare Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The organization provides services to patients suffering from kidney diseases. The registered office of the organization is situated at Peshawar and has a hospital at Kohat.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan. Approved accounting standards comprise Accounting and Financial Reporting Standards for Small Size Entities (SSEs) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following significant accounting policies have been applied consistently in preparation of these accounts:

3.1. Accounting Convention

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

3.2. Property, Plant, and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impaired loss, if any. Depreciation is provided on the reducing balance method and charged to income to write off the depreciation amount of each asset over its estimated useful life at the rates specified in Note No. 4.

Depreciation is charged on the asset when it is available for use.

Maintenance and repairs are charged to income as and when incurred. Major renewals and improvements are capitalized, and assets so replaced, if any, are retired. Gains or losses on the sale or retirement of assets, if any, are included in the income statement currently.

3.3. Revenue Recognition

Revenue of the Organization is recognized at the fair value of consideration received and receivable under the following criteria:

i. Donation/Zakat Recognized on a receipt basis.

ii. Hospital Income Recognized when related expenses are incurred.

iii. Profit on Bank Account Accounted for on a receipt basis.

3.4. Provisions

Provisions are recognized when there is a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events. It is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

Contraction of the charter

3.5. Receivables

Receivables are carried at the original invoice amount, less estimates made for doubtful receivables based on a review of outstanding amounts at the year-end. Balances considered bad or irrecoverable are written off when identified. Other receivables are recognized at nominal amounts, which is the fair value of the consideration to be received in the future.

3.6. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are carried at cost. For the purpose of cash flow statements, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash in hand, balances with banks, and highly liquid short-term investments that are convertible to known amounts of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

3.7. Payables

Liabilities for trade and other payables are carried at cost, which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in the future for goods and services received, whether billed to the entity or not.
